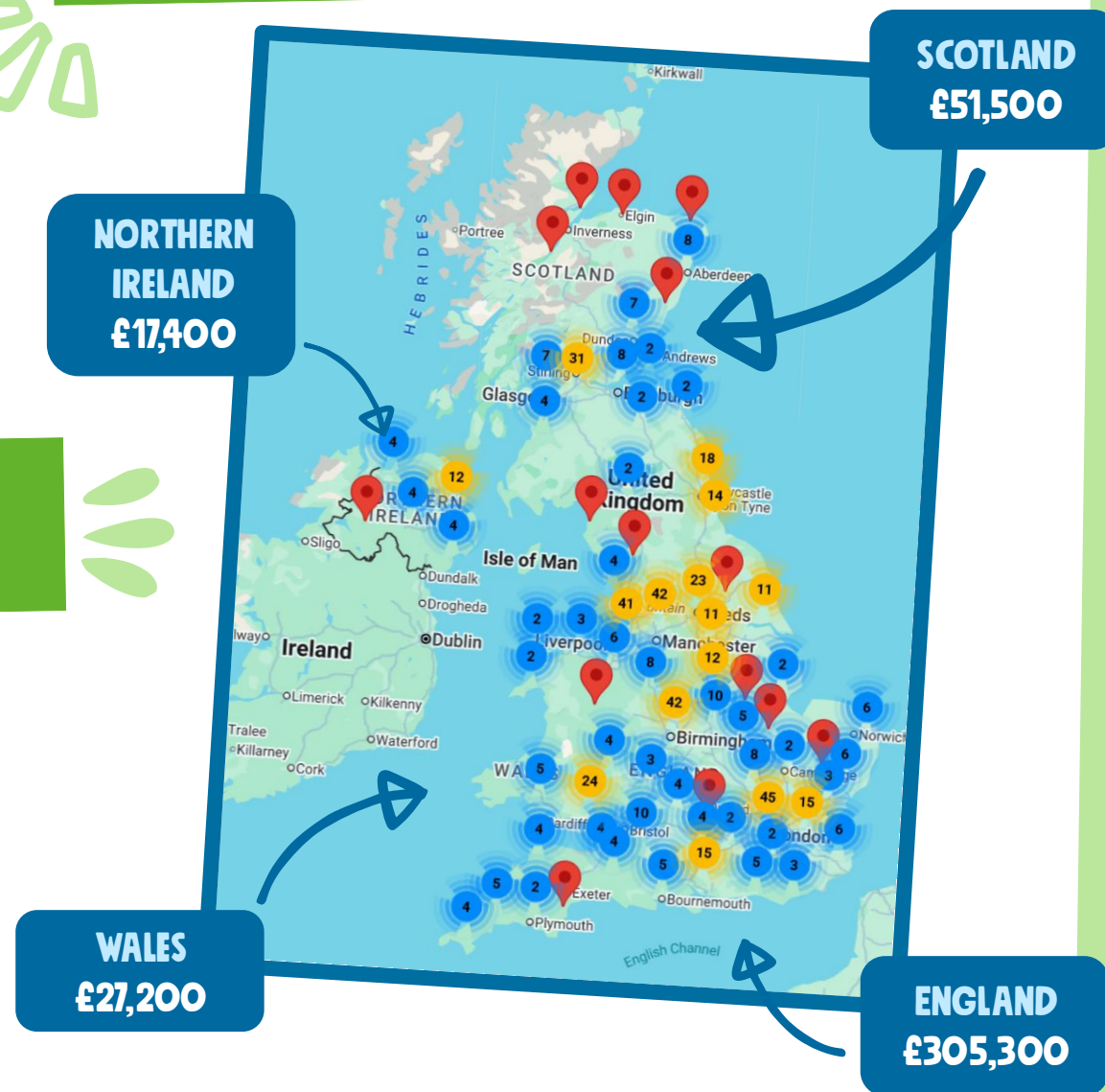

WOLVERHAMPTON ALZ CAFE

WEST MIDLANDS, ENGLAND

Wolverhampton Alz Café offers a lifeline for people living with dementia and their carers, creating a safe, welcoming space to connect, share experiences, and enjoy time together. Entirely volunteer-led, the Café runs monthly coffee mornings and evening events, combining companionship with music and entertainment—all free of charge to remove barriers to participation.

Our funding enabled the group to host a special Christmas party for around 100 attendees, complete with a fish and chip supper and live musical entertainment. For many, this was the only festive celebration they could attend, providing warmth, joy, and a sense of belonging at a time that can feel particularly isolating. Beyond the event itself, these gatherings help strengthen self-support networks and friendships that continue long after the evening ends, reducing loneliness and improving wellbeing for both individuals and families.

MEMORY LANE CAFE

SOWERBY BRIDGE, ENGLAND

Memory Lane Café creates a dementia-friendly environment for people living with memory problems and those experiencing isolation, offering a safe, welcoming space to connect. Their regular cafés in Sowerby Bridge and Halifax provide games, crafts, conversation, and support from dedicated volunteers, helping members and carers feel less alone.

Our funding enabled this amazing group to expand its support beyond the café sessions by reinvesting in specialist 'dementia-support' equipment for home use. Items such as day/night clocks and robotic companion cats help reduce confusion, provide comfort, and ease the strain on carers. This project ensures that members can continue to live well and maintain independence between café visits, bringing reassurance and dignity to some of the most vulnerable in the community.

THE FORGE PROJECT

NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE, ENGLAND

The Forge Project supports people experiencing homelessness in North Lincolnshire, offering a safe, welcoming space where individuals can access food, warmth, and vital support services. Open seven days a week, the centre provides nutritious meals alongside signposting and referrals to help people move towards healthier, more secure lives.

Our funding enabled The Forge Project to host a special Christmas Day event, serving a substantial breakfast and a hearty festive meal for up to 70 guests. Beyond the food, the day created a sense of belonging and joy—volunteers and staff were on hand to share warmth, conversation, and kindness, reminding every guest that they are valued and not forgotten. This event didn't just meet a basic need; it offered hope and human connection, which can be life-changing for those on the journey out of homelessness.

WEST MIDLANDS, ENGLAND

The Meeting Place provides a warm and inclusive environment at the heart of the community, supporting adults with learning disabilities to connect, build friendships, and enjoy social activities. Regular sessions feature games, music, and shared experiences that fostered companionship, reduced isolation, and promote inclusion.

Our funding enabled The Meeting Place to host a special Christmas buffet for around 40 members, along with their friends and families. Held on the last Saturday before Christmas, this event transformed the familiar setting into a festive celebration, complete with food and music. For many attendees who live alone or have limited family connections, the occasion provided not only a hearty meal but a sense of belonging and inclusion during what can be a challenging time of year. By supporting this project, we are helping to ensure that those who might otherwise spend the season in isolation could share in the joy of community and celebration.

ONE LOVE LUNCHEON CLUB

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE, ENGLAND

The One Love Luncheon Club (OLLC) is a lifeline for elderly and vulnerable adults in Milton Keynes, with a special focus on the black and minority ethnic community. Each week, the club provides hot, culturally familiar meals that do more than nourish—they connect people to their heritage, evoke memories, and create a sense of belonging. For many elders, these gatherings are the highlight of their week, offering companionship, laughter, and a safe space where they feel valued and understood.

Our funding enabled OLLC to continue delivering these vital services, ensuring that elders who might otherwise feel isolated have access to nutritious food and a warm, welcoming environment. Alongside the meals, the club offers activities that encourage conversation and friendship, helping to reduce loneliness and strengthen community ties. This project not only tackles food insecurity but also preserves cultural traditions and fosters intergenerational connections, creating a stronger, more inclusive community where everyone feels that they belong.

FRIENDS OF ISAAC'S FOOD BANK

WORCESTERSHIRE, ENGLAND

Isaac's Food Bank began in 2020 when Isaac, then just nine years old, set up a pop-up greenhouse on his driveway to collect food for those struggling during the pandemic. What started as a small act of kindness has grown into six sites across Redditch, distributing over 3,500 food parcels this year, with plans for a seventh site in early 2026.

The food bank operates 365 days a year, offering appointments without referrals and a community pantry that rescues surplus food from supermarkets to reduce waste. Our funding helped Isaac and his team purchase essential food items to meet rising demand through the winter months, ensuring families and individuals in crisis have access to nutritious food and support when they need it most.

CHAMPIONS COMMUNITY SPORT AND HEALTH CIC

WEST YORKSHIRE, ENGLAND

Champions Community Sport and Health CIC was founded in 2020 to address a growing issue in South Leeds – children and young people from low-income families missing out on sport, becoming inactive, and in some cases, drawn into anti-social behaviour. Craig Gilmore and his amazing wife Sam responded by creating free, turn-up-and-play football sessions every Saturday on Hunslet Moor. Their ethos is simple: everyone is welcome, regardless of age, ability, or background. Today, the sessions attract over 120 participants, including those with disabilities and even players training at elite level.

Alongside football, Champions provides free breakfast and lunch, plus surplus food parcels to take home, as most members arrive hungry. Our funding helped the group purchase essential food items to cover gaps in donations, ensuring every young person could enjoy a hot meal during sessions. This support not only tackles food insecurity but also creates a safe, positive space where young people can thrive, stay active, and feel part of a community.

CRAFT COLLECTIVE

DERRY, NORTHERN IRELAND

Craft Collective is a volunteer-led craft group based in a rural area outside Limavady, bringing people together to learn new skills in a relaxed, social setting. The group encourages local residents to explore a variety of arts and crafts while connecting with others, helping reduce isolation and boost mental wellbeing.

Our funding supported a programme of creative workshops designed to foster friendships and keep minds active. Participants learned new techniques, shared ideas, and enjoyed the sense of achievement that comes from making something by hand. This project creates a welcoming space where people can build confidence, stay engaged, and feel part of a supportive community.

GROW CARDIFF

GLAMORGAN, WALES

Grow Cardiff runs four health and wellbeing community gardens across the city, offering a safe, welcoming space for people to connect, learn, and enjoy nature. Weekly sessions bring local residents together to garden, share skills, and build friendships, while promoting mental and physical wellbeing.

Our funding enabled Grow Cardiff to deliver a winter programme of indoor, nature-themed craft sessions for adults facing loneliness and mental health challenges. Participants created art inspired by the gardens, learned new skills, and shared nutritious meals made with garden-grown produce.

These sessions provided warmth, companionship, and a vital lifeline during the colder months, ensuring people could stay connected and supported when they needed it most.

Music & Memories Choir brings together people living with dementia and their carers to share the joy of singing and social connection. Established in 2013, the group meets regularly in Hamilton, creating moments of fun, identity, and emotional connection through music.

Our funding supported a special Christmas lunch for members, carers, and volunteers, held in a local restaurant. This festive event gave everyone the chance to relax, celebrate their recent concert, and enjoy time together away from the usual rehearsal space.

By enabling this gathering, the project strengthened friendships, reduced isolation, and showcased that people with dementia remain active, valued members of the community.

Winnr Sports CIC is dedicated to improving young people’s health and wellbeing through inclusive, community-led initiatives. In an area where youth opportunities are limited, the group provides a safe space for teenagers and young adults to build confidence, resilience, and social connections.

Our funding enabled Winnr Sports to deliver weekly boxing fitness sessions, removing barriers to participation by supplying gloves, pads, safety gear, and refreshments. These sessions promote physical fitness, mental wellbeing, and teamwork, while creating positive pathways for young people in one of the UK’s most deprived areas.

This project ensures local youth have access to structured, supportive activities that foster healthier lifestyles and stronger community ties.

ANAND GROUP

LEICESTERSHIRE, ENGLAND

Anand Group is a voluntary social group for people aged 60 and over, offering a safe and welcoming space to reduce isolation and promote wellbeing. Members meet weekly for light exercise, healthy snacks, and the chance to socialise.

Our funding supported the group's vibrant Diwali celebration and will also enable them to host an inclusive Hindu New Year event. Covering hall hire, lunch, music, and decorations, these gatherings bring older people together – many of whom live alone or face health challenges – creating joy, connection, and a sense of belonging.

This project ensures some of the most vulnerable members of the community experience cultural celebrations and companionship, improving mental wellbeing and reducing loneliness.

Jamaica Society Leeds has been a cornerstone of cultural and social support in Chapeltown since 1977, championing Jamaican-British heritage and providing vital services for elders and families.

Our funding enabled the group to host an intergenerational Christmas celebration at Jamaica House, bringing together older residents, many at risk of isolation, with younger volunteers for a joyful, culturally rich event. Guests enjoyed a traditional Jamaican festive meal, carol singing, and Christmas reggae music, with Santa delivering cards and gifts to elders.

This project created a warm, inclusive space that strengthened community bonds, affirmed cultural identity, and ensured those who might otherwise spend Christmas alone felt valued and connected.
